Thanks in large part to donor support, our operating rooms have recently been outfitted with leading-edge technology, elevating care for every patient who enters.

You have helped advance our hospital's world-class surgical program to new levels of excellence. Thanks to donors like you, our surgical team has access to leading-edge technology, including advanced robotics. A new surgical robot, called the *da Vinci Xi*, allows our surgeons to operate with exceptional, almost superhuman, precision. This use of robotics enables minimally invasive surgeries, leading to shorter recovery times for patients, less pain and an earlier return to normal activities and quality of life. Furthermore, an operating suite with specialized software for viewing and manipulating images is also part of our new surgical floor. Guided Therapeutics one of few surgical systems in Ontario for 3-D CT imaging — will provide our sarcoma patients with a more comfortable experience, quicker recoveries and better outcomes.

In September, Dr. Drucker was inducted into the Canadian Medical Hall of Fame. Earlier in the year, he was awarded the 2021 Canada Gairdner International Award for research that has helped revolutionize treatments for type 2 diabetes, obesity, and intestinal disorders. Dr. Drucker's ongoing research is looking to uncover a greater understanding of type 2 diabetes. He aims to discover opportunities for drug development and new treatments for those living with the disease.
